Admission to a minor is open to students declared in a bachelor’s degree, the A.A.B. or A.A.S. degree or the A.T.S. degree (not Individualized Program major). Students declared only in the A.A. or A.S. degree or the A.T.S. degree in Individualized Program may not declare a minor. Students may not pursue a minor and a major in the same discipline.

² FR 33091 is taken twice. Courses taken at the Paris Institute that relate to the professions may fulfill one of these required courses with approval.

- Minimum 6 credit hours in the minor must be upper-division coursework (30000 and 40000 level).
